*On a note, put your name and class level inside the box, and if the box is for a boy, girl, or neutral (do NOT seal the box, it must remain open!)

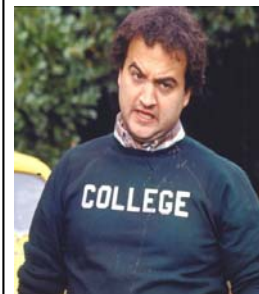
*Put it in Mr. Lewis's office

Community Service Assembly 22/11/11

Community Service is volunteer work given to the community, be it on a local, national, or international level. Projects at QSI include such activities as raising funds to assist a disadvantaged primary school in northeast Guangdong Province, supporting established programs to "Save the Panda" and increasing student awareness about environmental issues. As part of the QSI Shekou Community Service program, each Secondary Student I-IV is required to perform a minimum number of 35 hours for the year (3.5 hours per month) of quality volunteer work. It is up to each student to choose projects that seem most worthwhile and those that interest his/her personally. Students are certainly welcome to complete more than the minimum number of hours in each year.

Students do not have to perform Community Service each month. It is entirely up to each individual as to how they plan to complete the requirement. Those students entering QSI after December will have their minimum requirement of hours reduced.
