As you know last week we explored our hands, fingers and toes. We had fun counting our toes and tickling our feet. The children sang songs and read amazing stories about fingers and toes. We also played a matching game where the children looked at photos of different animals and had to match the feet to the correct animal. We continued this matching game using images of human hands and feet. Another fun activity that they loved was to play with finger paint. The children were asked to choose a solid color of paint. Each child explored their sense of touch by feeling the texture and coolness of the paint as it oozed through their little fingers and hands. Another project was to paint their hands and place them on a white sheet of paper to create either a Turkey or Tree.

The songs, poems that we learned this week were, "Where is Thumbkin", "Pat-A-Cake" and "Five Little Monkey's"

The 3 years old are learning about **Community Helpers** and one of the most inspiring jobs that we tackled this week is about **Teacher** and their huge role in our society. We read inspiring books about teachers, did "switch teaching" (all 3YO teachers rotated classes to spend circle time in each class) and students role-played being a teacher. For number 6, the children counted, cut and pasted six objects that show the number 6. No doubt the 3 Y.O's are doing great in counting.
