What kept the 3YO's busy these past several days?

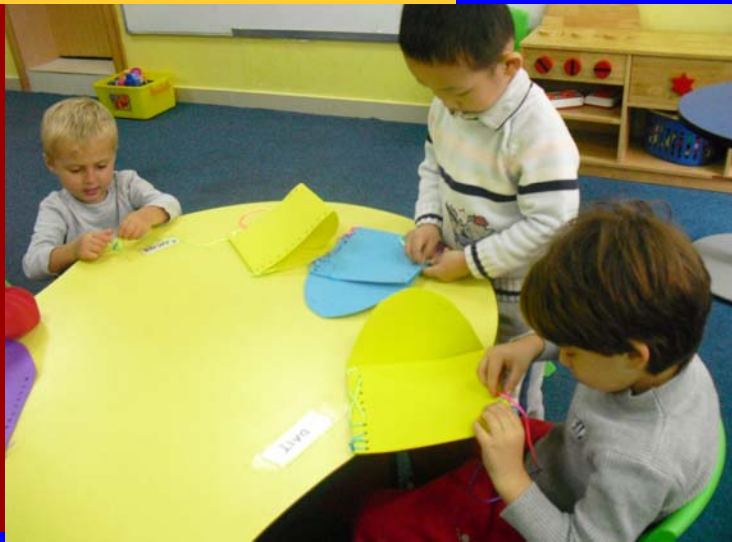
