4 Year Old

The topic of the week is Seasons. What a great time to talk about seasons! One of the best *seasons* is *autumn* which is also called *fall*. Everything around us is changing - the leaves are falling from the trees and the colors of *fall* are just beautiful: red, orange, and yellow! The animals and the plants are also preparing for the *winter*. Our 4-Year-Old classes have been learning about all of the *seasons*. The children participated in lots of activities to help understand what a *season* is and how each *season* brings something new. They also learned how the weather changes with the different *seasons*. We made four trees for the four different *seasons*. One tree represents *fall*, and we used the orange, brown, red and yellow leaves. The second tree represented *winter*, and we glued paper snow flakes to look like snow. The third tree had flowers and green leaves to represent *spring*, while the last tree had green leaves and red apples to represent *summer*. This was just one of the many exciting and interesting lessons that we have been doing in the classrooms to help your little ones learn everything possible about the *SEASONS*.
